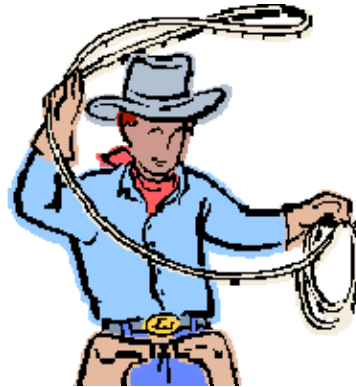

Marjorie E. Curry, 95, of East Moline, died Sunday, May 25, 2008, in Silver Cross Nursing Center, Rock Island.

Services are 11 a.m. Wednesday at First Presbyterian Church, East Moline, with the Rev. Rebecca Sherwood officiating. Burial is at Rose Lawn Memorial Estate, Moline. Visitation is 4-8 p.m. today at Trimble Funeral and Cremation Center, Moline, and one hour before service at the church. Memorials may be made to the church.

The former Marjorie Evelyn Long was born Nov. 17, 1912, in Rural Township, Rock Island County, the daughter of Lester E. and Henrietta M. Schoening Long. She graduated from Sherrard Community High School in 1931, where she was active in 4-H, winning many awards and showing livestock at shows as far away as Chicago. She married Kenneth L. Curry on March 30, 1941, in Davenport. He died Sept. 24, 2000.

She was co-founder of Ken Curry Construction in 1944, and remained active in the company until the mid 1960s.

Marj was an active member on the Board of Education at Wells School in East Moline. She was a member of First Presbyterian Church, East Moline, for 54 years, and was very involved with the Presbyterian Women's organization. She served on the board of Ruling Elders and as a deacon, and often provided rides to church for those who couldn't drive. For many years, she had a large garden and many fruit trees. She loved to can and provide fruits and vegetables to her family and friends. Her applesauce and freezer strawberry jam were special favorites of her grandchildren. She loved playing bingo at Friendship Manor and enjoyed drawing and crocheting until her arthritis interfered.

Marj is survived by a son and daughter-in-law, Keith and Carol Curry of East Moline; three grandchildren and their spouses, Kyle and Stacy Curry of St. Paul, Minn., Clayton and Susan Curry of East Moline, and Catherine and Brian McKeag of Moline; four great-grandchildren, Keely, Alexander, Madelyn and Daphne Curry; and a nephew, Paul Price Jr. of Aledo. She was preceded in death by her husband; a son, Gerald Curry; a sister, Grace Price; and a brother, Raymond Long.

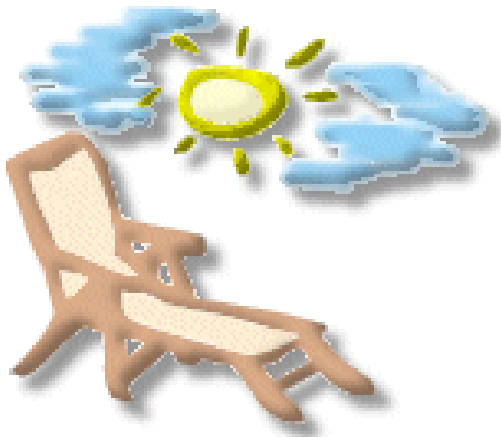

- Conferences should be recruiting events and fundraisers
- Sponsors - Look for an advantage for both sides
  - Both parties can promote each other through partnerships or relationships
- Spend more time promoting your event.
  - The biggest mistake – Spend time planning, but not enough time marketing
- There should be a standing committee for promotions.
- Send out “Save the Date” material far ahead of the event
  - Add bright stickers that can be put on calendars
- You gotta have a Gimmick!
  - Teasers!
  - Gradually increase your teasers. It takes seven times
  - Find seven different ways to promote your event
- Sponsorships – Double Up – Piggy back on things
- Look for fresh ideas for events
  - Sweeten it up every now and then
  - Go with current trends.
  - Branding – Gimmick
- Why do people belong to NAWIC?
  - Opportunity for business contacts
- Use Open Space Technology – Structured Organized Discussion
- Emotional attachment or draw.
  - Promote your feelings
  - Have people tell their stories. Stories with emotional appeal
- Do we have past scholarship recipients who could attend and tell their story?
  - Make a connection with feelings or emotions
- Your event must reflect your organization
  - Don’t distort your image
- Profile why you are an exceptional organization in what you do
